Feast of Divine Mercy

During the course of Jesus' revelations to Saint Faustina on the Divine Mercy He asked on numerous occasions that a feast day be dedicated to the Divine Mercy and that this feast be celebrated on the Sunday after Easter. The liturgical texts of that day, the 2nd Sunday of Easter, concern the institution of the Sacrament of Penance, the Tribunal of the Divine Mercy, and are thus already suited to the request of Our Lord. This Feast, which had already been granted to the nation of Poland and been celebrated within Vatican City, was granted to the Universal Church by Pope John Paul II on the occasion of the canonization of Sr. Faustina on 30 April 2000. In a decree dated 23 May 2000, the Congregation for Divine Worship and the Discipline of the Sacraments stated that "throughout the world the Second Sunday of Easter will receive the name Divine Mercy Sunday, a perennial invitation to the Christian world to face, with confidence in divine benevolence, the difficulties and trials that mankind will experience in the years to come." These papal acts represent the highest endorsement that the Church can give to a private revelation, an act of papal infallibility proclaiming the certain sanctity of the mystic, and the granting of a universal feast, as requested by Our Lord to St. Faustina.

YOUR DEACON DAYDREAMS

Are you counting on "leftovers" or still eating them from our recent Easter feasts? I have to admit, I really enjoy them & never turn down a "doggie" bag from anyone either. In fact, sometimes they even taste better the next day, especially when it comes to stews or soup. But one thing we should consider is to rely especially at the end of our days, in God's Divine Mercy.

The Easter season lasts fifty days, not just last Sunday & hopefully, you have been participating in the Divine Mercy Novena. Today, marks the end of the Novena on the day on which Our Lord promised that the floodgates of His mercy would be opened to sinners. This day is a wonderful opportunity for the faithful to open themselves to God's abundant mercy. "The Octave of Easter is a special eight days, & that is why St Pope JP II designated this day in 2000, Divine Mercy Sunday

It all started when St. Faustina Kowalska, a Polish nun in the 1930s, received several revelations from our Lord & followed His direction to have an image made of His Divine Mercy. Not only did she have a painting made that we revere today, but she recorded her experiences in a diary even though she did not have much schooling. In entry Diary 699, she wrote: "My daughter, tell the whole world about My inconceivable mercy. I desire that the Feast of Mercy be a refuge & a shelter for all souls, & especially for poor sinners. On that day the very depths of My tender mercy are open. I pour out a whole ocean of graces upon those souls who approach the fount of My mercy. The soul that will go to Confession & receive Holy Communion shall obtain complete forgiveness of sins & punishment. On that day are opened all the divine floodgates through which graces flow. Let no soul fear to draw near to Me, even though its sins be as scarlet. My mercy is so great that no mind, be it of man or of angel, will be able to fathom it throughout all eternity. Everything that exists has come from the very depths of My most tender mercy" Words straight from our Lord.

I hope you regularly pray the Divine Mercy chaplet as well. Many blessings & graces are offered at the hour of one's dying if recited. When you don't know where to turn, start with this prayer..For the Sake of His Sorrowful Passion, have mercy on us & the whole world. Share this with everyone you love & meet too. The Divine Mercy is available to all you believe, repent & return to the gospel. Don't let our Lenten discipline become something of the past either. Keep praying, fasting & almsgiving to keep our spiritual lives healthy. Don't answer with I am too busy either. In fact, don't be like the doubting St.Thomas who had to put his hands in Jesus' wounds to believe. Instead become like the "Thomas answered & said to him, "My Lord & my God!" Jesus said to him, "Have you come to believe because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and have believed." Jesus is fully present in the Holy Eucharist. Be a living witness to Jesus Christ. Share His message like St. Faustina did. Quoted again from the diary: Mankind will not have peace until it turns to the Fount of My mercy." See you in church?

FOOD DRIVE



How to recite the Chaplet of the Divine Mercy



The Chaplet of Mercy is recited using ordinary rosary beads of five decades.

Begin the Chaplet with the Sign of the Cross, 1 Our Father, 1 Hail Mary and The Apostle's Creed.

Then on the "Our Father" beads pray the following: Eternal Father, I offer You the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Your dearly beloved Son, Our Lord Jesus Christ, in atonement for our sins and those of the whole world.

On the ten small beads of each decade, pray the following:

For the sake of His sorrowful Passion, have mercy on us and on the whole world.

Conclude with (three times):

Holy God, Holy Mighty One, Holy Immortal One, have mercy on us and on the whole world.

Cómo recitar la Coronilla de la Misericordia

La Coronilla de Misericordia se recita usando cuentas de rosario ordinarias de cinco décadas.

Comenzar la Coronilla con el Padre Nuestro, el Avemaría y el Credo de los Apóstoles.

Luego, en la cuenta grande antes de cada década recitar:
Padre Eterno,
te ofrezco el Cuerpo, la Sangre,
el Alma y la Divinidad de Tu amadísimo Hijo,
Nuestro Señor Jesucristo, para el perdón de
nuestros pecados y los del mundo entero.

En las diez pequeñas cuentas de cada década, recitar:
Por Su dolorosa Pasión,
ten misericordia de nosotros y del mundo entero.

Finalizar con:
Santo Dios
Santo Dios Todopoderoso
Santo Inmortal,
ten misericordia de nosotros y del mundo entero.
(Recitar esto tres veces)

Jak odmawiać koronkę do Miłosierdzia Bożego ?

Modlimy się na paciorkach Różańca świętego.
Najpierw odmawiamy jeden raz:

Ojcze Nasz, Zdrowaś Maryjo i Wierzę w Boga....

Następnie na dużych paciorkach, mówimy jeden raz:

Ojcze Przedwieczny, ofiaruję Ci Ciało i Krew,
Duszę i Bóstwo najmilszego Syna Twojego,
a Pana naszego Jezusa Chrystusa,
na przebłaganie za grzechy nasze i całego świata.

A na małych paciorkach mówimy 10 razy:

Dla Jego bolesnej Męki...,
miej miłosierdzie dla nas i całego świata.

Na zakończenie, mówimy 3 razy:

Święty Boże, Święty Mocny, Święty Nieśmiertelny,
zmiłuj się nad nami i nad całym światem.

The New English Formula for Absolution

Some of you may have heard that starting today, Divine Mercy Sunday, the new formula of absolution will take effect. The prayer, familiar to Catholics, now says this:

*"God, the Father of mercies, through the death
and resurrection of his Son
has reconciled the world to himself
and sent the Holy Spirit among us for the
forgiveness of sins;
through the ministry of the Church may God
give you pardon and peace.
And I absolve you from your sins
in the Name of the Father + and of the Son +
and of the Holy Spirit."*

Here is what we will hear when we go to confession beginning today:

*"God, the Father of mercies, through the death
and resurrection of his Son
has reconciled the world to himself
and **poured out** the Holy Spirit for the
forgiveness of sins;
through the ministry of the Church may God
grant you pardon and peace.
And I absolve you from your sins
in the Name of the Father + and of the Son +
and of the Holy Spirit."*

As we can see, “poured out” will replace “sent,” while “grant” will be said rather than “give.” To be sure, this latest formula of absolution is not a new prayer. Rather, the translation is different in just two places. And the essential words of sacramental absolution, *“I absolve you from your sins in the name of the Father, (+) and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit,”* will remain unchanged. If, once the new translation goes into effect, a priest would revert back to “sent” and “give” instead of “poured out” and “grant,” then the absolution will still be valid. In this case, the penitent may rest assured.

The Doors We Lock

As a child, and even for a while as a teenager, I experienced an enormous amount of anxiety whenever I went to confession. For so many years I feared it. For so many years I waited in the confession line trembling, feeling sick to my stomach.

In the upper room after Christ’s Passion and death, the anxiety of the disciples was so strong that they locked themselves away. But still Christ found a way into their midst. He would not be prevented from bringing mercy and hope to a place shrouded in despair. No door barred in a moment of fear could keep him out.

This is the genius of the sacrament of Reconciliation — and of all sacraments, really. Here we are, restricted in so many ways by an existence that is woefully physical. We feel fear, and our body reacts, just as we feel anger and our body reacts.

How can God deliver mercy to us in this flesh-bound state? Through that very flesh which can feel so confining. Through confession, which requires a physical action, and the physical participation not just of the penitent but of the priest.

I don’t know how or why my anxiety around the sacrament has lessened over the years. Sometimes, I still feel it come roaring back unexpectedly, and maybe one day it will come back to stay. It doesn’t surprise me: after all, I am in the flesh, and I will, as Peter says today, “suffer through various trials.” But in all of them Christ will find me. He will not be kept away.

Let the house of Aaron say, “His mercy endures forever.” — Psalm 118:3
