Dear Parishioners.

Today's Sunday is commonly known as Good Shepherd Sunday, because the Gospel on the Fourth Sunday of Easter every year portrays Jesus proclaiming himself the Good Shepherd. It is also a day when we pray for new vocations to priesthood, religious life and permanent diaconate.

This Monday is the first day of May - the loveliest month of the year, and so the month fittingly dedicated to our Blessed Mother. In 2 weeks we will celebrate Mother's Day. This coming Saturday, May 6th and again on May 13th our parish will celebrate First Communion at Saints Bruno and Richard. We pray that the children receiving the Lord for the first time in the Eucharist will know that Jesus is always with them. And thank you to their catechists for working so hard with them this past year.

Drodzy Parafianie!

Dzisiejsza, czwarta już Niedziela Wielkanocna, nazywana jest często Niedzielą Dobrego Pasterza. Od wielu już lat obchodzona jest ona jako Świątowy Dzień Modlitw o Powołania. Choć wszyscy ludzie mają jakieś powołanie to jednak dziś, w sposób szczególny myślimy o powołaniach do służby Bożej, zarówno tych kapłańskich jak i zakonnych. Ciągłe musimy prosić Jezusa Chrystusa Dobrego Pasterza, aby nie zabrakło chętnych do pracy w Winnicy Pańskiej.

Jutro, w poniedziałek, rozpoczyna się Maj. Dla nas Polaków, początek maja jest nierozłącznie związany z Uroczystością Najświętszej Maryi Panny Królowej Polski oraz rocznicą uchwalenia Konstytucji 3 Maja. W czasie, gdy my Polacy będziemy świętować te wydarzenia, do hucznych obchodów szykować się będą też Meksykanie, ponieważ 5 maja obchodzą oni swoje święto Cinco de Mayo. Natomiast za 2 tygodnie, w niedzielę 14 maja, razem z Amerykanami, obchodzić będziemy Dzień Matki. Tego dnia w naszych modlitwach pamiętać będziemy o naszych Mamach, tak żyjących jak i zmarłych. Ich imiona można będzie wpisywać na specjalnych kopertkach wyłożonych przy wejściu do kościoła. Z ofiar składanych do tych kopert będzie potem odprawiona Nowenna Mszy św. zbiorowych w ich intencji.

W ubiegły czwartek, gościliśmy w naszym kościele ks. biskupa Roberta Casey, który udzielił sakramentu Bierzmowania ponad 70-osobowej grupie młodzieży z naszej parafii i szkoły. Teraz kolej na Pierwsze komunie św., które zaplanowane są na 2 najbliższe soboty.

YOUR DEACON DAYDREAMS

This is the time of the year when many of us are making vacation plans for the summer. Some of us will be traveling by air, others by car, train or bus. When we travel by air, there are set limits for the size of our carry-on luggage. If it doesn't fit in the measuring device, we have to check our bags or leave it behind. The tool is narrow for sure but how many of us try to escape checking our bags to be caught by the boarding crew at the gate. This weekend's reading from the Acts of the Apostles says: "Save yourselves from this corrupt generation." Meaning, if we want to be part of the kingdom of heaven & enter thru the narrow gate aka Jesus, "Repent & be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins. Otherwise we cannot receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. Jesus said, "Whoever does not enter a sheepfold through the gate but climbs over elsewhere is a thief & a robber. But whoever enters thru the gate is the shepherd of the sheep."

When I was kid & we went to the show, someone would always try to sneak a friend in thru the theater doors emergency exit. However, it hardly went undiscovered because as soon as the outside door was opened, blinding light would enter the dark theater. Well, Jesus is the light of the world. Evil prefers darkness. The true Shepherd Jesus also said "...and the sheep will follow him, because they recognize his voice. But they will not follow a stranger, they will run away from him."

Unfortunately, the secular culture is working very hard to speak louder than the true shepherd. The evil one has been duping people with its false attractions of worldly goods, power, etc, & many people are led astray. As parents, one of the most frequent petitions called in during the radio broadcasts of the rosary & the chaplet of Divine Mercy on 950 Relevant Radio is for family members who are not practicing their faith or just have stopped believing entirely. It's a growing epidemic of the culture of "none's" who have no faith.

Two weeks ago, I was blessed to be able to attend St John Vianney Parish's holy hour on Diving Mercy Sunday. My classmate the deacon, quoted a passage from St. Faustina's diary, where Jesus said : "There are souls who thwart My efforts (Diary, 1682). Souls without love or devotion, souls full of egoism & selfishness, proud & arrogant souls full of deceit & hypocrisy, lukewarm souls who have just enough warmth to keep themselves alive: My Heart cannot bear this" (1702). But He doesn't give up on them. Our job is to pray for those to one day recognize the voice of the true shepherd. Don't stop listening to His call in our own life either. Don't be seduced into thinking your way is the best....do it God's way in order to be saved. "Thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven." See you in church?

Why do we do that? Catholic Life Explained

Question:

Does it matter what leg you kneel on when genuflecting?

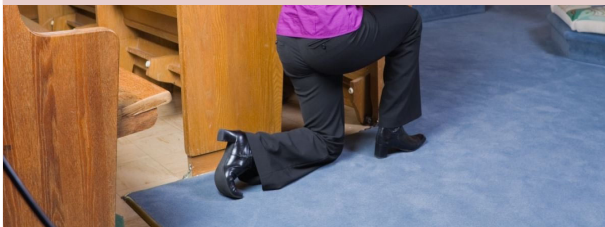
Answer:

Genuflection is an act of devotion that literally means “to bend the knee.” For many Catholics, it’s an almost automatic gesture that we perform before entering our pew or row of seats at Mass. But, like many of the symbols and gestures of our faith tradition, genuflecting can also be an invitation for deeper reflection.

The practice of “bending the knee” is an ancient way of recognizing the presence of someone greater than we are. It has been said that the practice dates back to the time of Alexander the Great, but it became a common part of etiquette in the royal courts of the Middle Ages. From throne rooms and palaces, it was a small step to genuflecting, becoming part of the devotional lives of Christians who used this secular gesture as a way of recognizing the presence of the One who is King of Kings, especially in the Eucharist. In our tradition, although many have been taught or prefer to genuflect by placing their right knee on the ground, there is no prescribed way to genuflect. This is especially important to keep in mind if physical limitations or age make certain movements difficult for us.

Today, Catholics are asked to genuflect in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament (whether in the tabernacle or exposed on the altar during Eucharistic adoration). So, while it has become second nature to genuflect before entering your seat in church, we should pay attention to where the Blessed Sacrament is kept in each church or chapel we visit, and genuflect in the direction of the tabernacle where the Blessed Sacrament is kept. In churches or chapels in which the tabernacle is in a separate space, we are invited to simply bow toward the altar.
