

Today we remember with sadness the attacks of September 11, 2001. The memory of those days seems as clear as when the attack first took place. Today also, on Sunday, September 11th, we are honored to welcome Bishop Andrew Wypych to St. Richard church for the 2:00 pm Mass. The Bishop will bless and dedicate the stained glass windows during that Mass. Stained Glass windows have always played an important part in our spiritual journey. Drodzy Parafianie!

Dzisiaj, 11września, przypada 21-a rocznica zamachów terrorystycznych w Ameryce, w których zginęło prawie 3 tysiące ludzi (w tym także Polacy). Rocznica tego wydarzenia jest dla historii świata, a w sposób szczególny dla historii Stanów Zjednoczonych, wstrząsającą prawdą o zagrożeniach, jakie niesie ze sobą terroryzm XXI wieku. Niech ta rocznica będzie dniem zadumy i modlitwy za ofiary tamtych zamachów.

Dziś też, w niedzielę, 11 września, gościmy w naszej parafii ks. biskupa Andrzeja Wypycha, który w kościele św. Ryszarda, na Mszy o godz. 2:00 po południu, dokona poświęcenia witraży wykonanych dla tej świątyni. Witraże zawsze odgrywały ważną rolę w naszej duchowej wędrówce. Mogą one uczyć, pocieszać i inspirować tych, którzy na nie patrzą. Dla wielu piękno witraży uspokaja i pozwala odczuć atmosferę modlitwy w kościele. Pod tym względem kolory mogą mieć czasami taki sam wpływ na emocje, jak obraz. Światło wpadające przez witraż ma olśniewający efekt, tworząc piękne wzory tam, gdzie pada. Pomaga to stworzyć atmosferę, w której łatwiej jest medytować. Witraże są czymś więcej, niż tylko ozdobą kościoła, która ma nadać mu ładny i kolorowy wygląd. Podobnie jak sama świątynia, są one okazją do ewangelizacji i wciągania ludzi w głęboko osobistą i duchowa relacje z Chrystusem.

The Stained Glass Windows of St. Richard Church - #8

In a lead-up to this weekend's dedication and blessing of the front entryway stained glass to take place Sunday, September 11th at a special 2:00 PM Mass, we have for the past seven weeks been illustrating and describing the symbolism of our existing stained glass windows. Today we review the last east side window: **Christ will Come Again.**



<u>Upper Panels:</u> An empty golden throne with a purple (color of royalty) backrest surrounded by various jewels - the throne of Christ the King - vacant and awaiting "Judgment Day" - the second coming of Christ. Symbols of two of the Evangelist: St. Luke - ox (left), and St. John - eagle (right), stand adjacent to the throne. In the upper left panel - the Seven Trumpets of Apocalypse herald the second coming of Christ, while a lightning bolt - upper right panel - symbolizes the tremors of the heavens. Above the throne, seven flaming lamps.

"Flashes of lightning were coming from the throne, and the sound of peals of thunder, and in front of the throne there were seven flaming lamps burning, the seven Spirits of God." Rv. 4:5

Main Panels: Vibrant colors - shades of yellows, gold's, oranges and, dazzling reds - predominate. Featured at the top of both Main Panels is the bottom portion of the empty throne of God, flanked by the symbols of the other two Evangelists - St. Matthew - man (left) and St. Mark - lion (right). The use of the various shades of glass gives the throne a truly three dimensional quality. Notice also the river of life-giving water flowing from the center bottom of the throne, a theme repeated from west wall window #4.

In the right panel a large white dove, symbol of the Holy Spirit, is in back of Mary the Mother of Jesus. Mary is clothed in glowing garments - bright white, pale blue and clear glass – lovingly holding the Christ Child. Note also the jewel beads in each halo.

To the lower left emerging from the darkness of hell, a deep red colored diabolical figure with a crown riding a menacing red dragon having seven heads or "diadems" represented by seven green stones, poised to devour the Infant Christ Child, while Mary, Mother of our Savior, protects her Son from the "evil one" as the dragon's red tail tries to run under Mary's feet. The light colors to the right of Mary and Baby Jesus represent the Light of Christ.

"A great sign appeared in the sky, a woman clothed with the sun, with the moon under her feet... Then another sign appeared in the sky; it was a huge red dragon, with seven heads and ten horns, and on its head were seven diadems." Rv 12

All of the aforementioned symbols and figures surrounded by a rainbow, symbol of God's covenant with man to never flood the Earth again, and blue sky emanating from the bottom of the throne. In this window the heavy marquis shape leading brings together the upper and lower panels to form a vignette symbolizing the second coming. Lastly, running across the bottom, from left, smaller buildings; and right, larger buildings with three domes and a cross, all symbolizing the New Jerusalem.

Because of the size of each window, the panels had to be drawn on commercial Kraft Paper mounted on ply-wood in the artist's back yard patio. The lead lines for each panel had to be meticulously drawn to ensure the proper fit of each piece of glass.

Some things in life you never every forget, especially when it comes to historic events that effect everyone. If I asked where you were when Pres.Kennedy was assassinated or when the Space Shuttle Challenger exploded & of course 9/11 happened, most of us would know immediately. 
